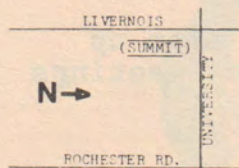

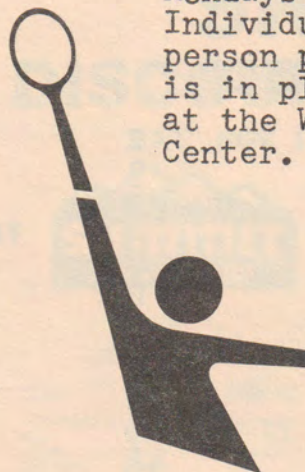

A ski trip already? Well, not yet. But the Skiwi's are going to Whistler, British Columbia (Western Canada) on February 27th to March 6th, 1983. The Whistler & Blackomb area is the only base to base mountains in North America, this means you can ski down one mountain and take a chair up the other.

Whistler Mountain is 4,300 vertical feet of mostly intermediate skiing and lots of LONG trails (5 & 7 miles). Blackomb is a 4,000 vertical foot mountain known for its fall line skiing (fall line skiing is when the run follows the natural slope of the mountain). It also has a 7 mile trail.

We will be staying in condos 5 minutes walking distance away from the mountains. The trip includes:

All Ground & Air Transportation  
Taxes  
Lodging

And other activities all for a price which you will not believe, \$535.00 for members & M.D.S.C. club members & \$555.00 for non-members. We will be flying a PACIFIC WESTERN CHARTER from Windsor to Vancouver, B.C., and a 2 hr. bus ride to Whistler. Lodging will be 4/Condo. These are 2 bedroom & 2 bath condos with a kitchen and fireplace.

There will be helicopter skiing (approx. \$150.00/day) and a possible side trip to Vancouver for a day and night at (approx. \$40.00/person).

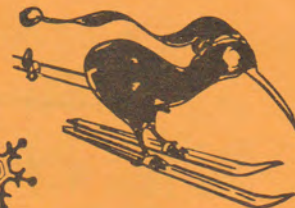

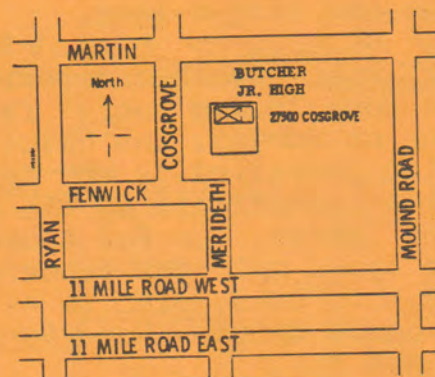

## SURPLUS SKIWI FOOD FEEDS THE NEEDY

An estimated six to ten impoverished families in Detroit got a surprise of steak dinners compliments of the Skiwi Ski Club and Crossroads.



This all came about after the September Hayride when event coordinator, Cheryl Filarski, found herself with a surplus of food. The food, including 25 steaks, was too much to throw away. Bruce Freeburger suggested Crossroads, a kitchen and food distribution center in Detroit, run by the Episcopal Church.

Cheryl liked the idea, Skiwi President Bruce Mandel gave his approval, and Bruce Freeburger delivered the food to the center.

Fr. James McLaren, Director of Crossroads, was very grateful of the Skiwi's donation and a bit surprised. He has never gotten a donation from a ski club before.

In addition to the steaks, a 50lb. bag of potatoes, a bushel of sweet-corn, and 13 tubs of sour cream, plus butter and steak sauce were donated.

Crossroads feeds 40 to 50 people every day, plus delivers food to needy families. It is located on 67 Forest off of Woodward by the Vernor's plant. Anyone wishing to donate more food can call Crossroads at 831-2000.



## RACING REPORT

Hopefully, now that cooler weather is here, you are thinking seriously about skiing. Last year some people waited until the last minute to make their plans to ski. When the time to do it came, they didn't have any money saved, or couldn't get the time off from work. Some even waited until ski season began, then figured they could get into shape on the hill.

I hope you are not waiting until the last minute. If you do, you will probably miss at least one weekend or maybe more. Also your first days of skiing will be wasted on conditioning instead of skiing your best. For racers this means lost World Cup points due to poor finishes.

Rule changes this year primarily concern Veteran Racers. You must be 40 yrs. of age to enter into the Veteran Mens classes. There are now three Mens classes equal to **Classes A-AA for Vet.I, Class B for Vet.II, and Classes c-D for Vet.III.**

Women now have a Veteran Class. It is for women over 35 yrs. of age. They will compete on the same course as the A-Men and A-Women.

Just to add a touch of confusion to our otherwise smooth operations, there will be five courses this year instead of our usual four.

- Course #1 - E-Men, E-Women, and VET.I Men.
- Course #2 - VET. Women, A-Women, and A-Men.
- Course #3 - VET.II Men and B-Men.
- Course #4 - B-Women, VET.III Men, and C-Men.
- Course #5 - C-Women, D-Women, and D-Men.

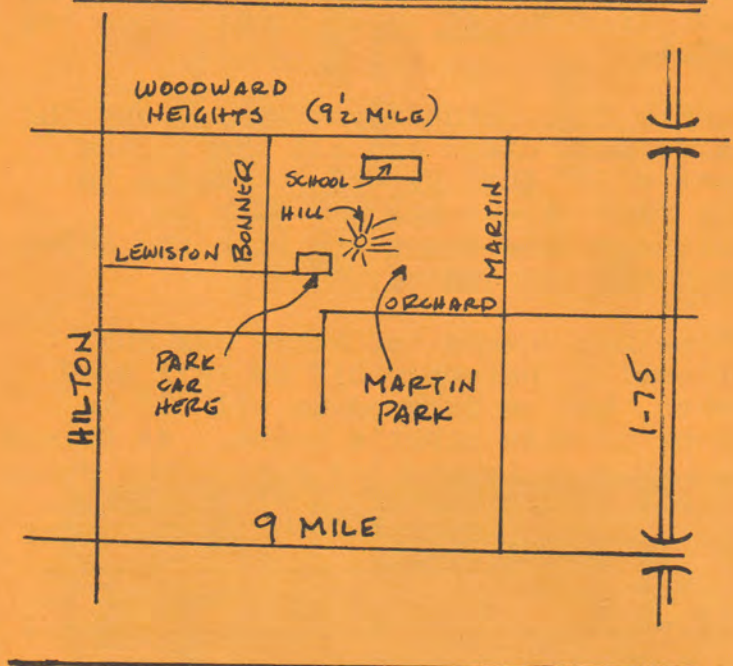
To reduce some of that confusion we will have one bib assigned for the season. Early registration is a must this year. I will have the registration forms at each meeting.

It will cost you \$10.00 this year to register to race. \$5.00 is a deposit on your bib. You will get it back when you return the bib. The other \$5.00 is used to run the races.

Dryland slaloms will be held on October 10th & 24th and November 7th & 14th. We are starting at noon, at Martin Park, so bring your poles. If you want to grass ski, bring your boots. See map for location.

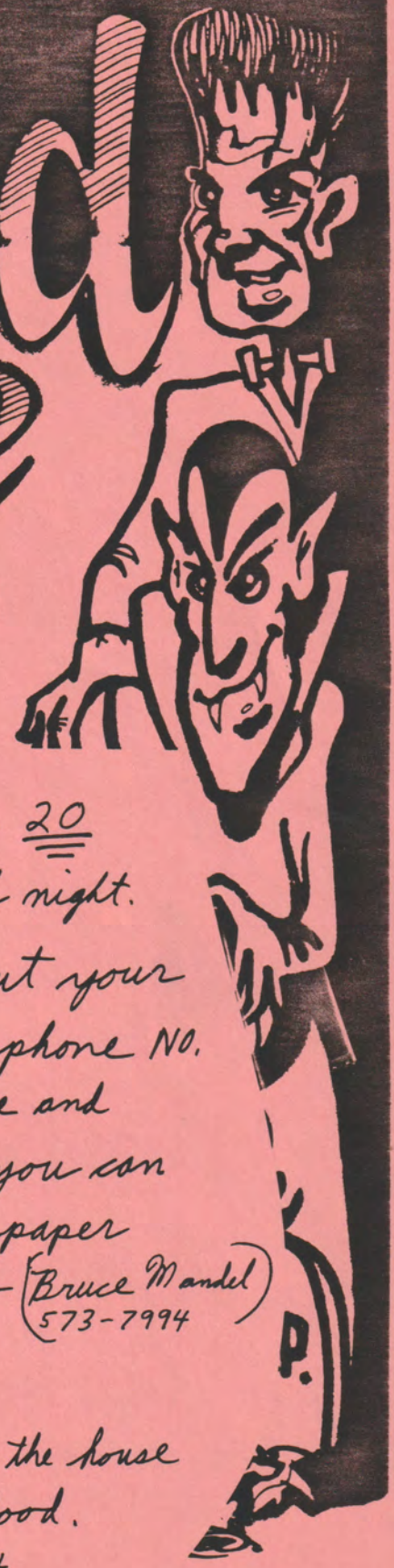

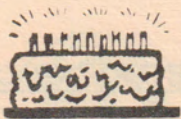
