Now that summer is gone and the snow is about to fly, it's time to start thinking about the upcoming ski season.

On Dec. 17,18,19, the Skiwi's will travel North to ski Crystal Mt. WE WANT TO INVITE YOU TO COME RACE WITH US.

WHAT CLASS DO I RACE IN?

Racers run in one of eight men's classes or one of six women's classes.

Three of the men's classes are called Veteran classes. These are for men 40 yrs. or older.

Women also have a Veteran's class for women 35 yrs. or older.

Both men and women have classes Elite (for experts) to Class D (for beginning racers).

You will be assigned to a class on the first race weekend by means of running a qualifying race. Your time through the course will be recorded and your skiing ability will be judged by a panel of experienced racers. These will determine which class you can be competitive in.

As your racing ability improves and your times get quicker, you may be moved to another class. This is so that you are racing against racers of your ability.

THE SKIWIPOORT INTERVIEWS
GLORIA JARACZ

Pick up a copy of the November 1982 issue of Skiing and you will find three pictures of Gloria Jaracz (pages 64, 65, and 72). Gloria skied with the Skinik Ski Club to victory in the Grand Marnier Ski Challenge.

Skiwiport: Gloria, what is the Grand Marnier Ski Challenge?

Gloria: It is a series of races for a team of 6 people, from the same ski club, racing against other ski clubs. There are five regions across the country and the winners from each region race against each other for the National Championship. We won.

Skiwiport: Those not familiar with racing will want to know why you didn't race with the Skiwi Ski Club. So for the sake of those in our club I'll ask why?

Gloria: I am a member of both clubs and eligible to race for either club. The combination of me on the Skinik team was much more competitive.

Skiwiport: Since you race for two ski clubs, the Skiwi's and the Skinik's, how do these two clubs compare?

Gloria: The Skinik's have their heart and soul into racing but they do run social events. The Skiwi's is a much larger club that does social events, but also runs a racing team. This year however, the Skiwi's seem to be really serious about it.



Skiwiport: There is this mental image that all expert racers started racing before adolescence and their parents own a ski slope. Is that true with you?

Gloria: I am the only one in my family that skis. Not even my twin sister skis. I didn't start racing until I was 21. I first skied when I was in the seventh grade, but I never skied more than a few times a year until I was two years out of high school.

Skiwiport: How would a recreational skier benefit by racing?

Gloria: I would encourage them to ski more often by running the races and you get to know members of your club better.

Skiwiport: Do you need special racing skis or boots to race?

Gloria: No. They help in the advanced classes, but I started out in Class A and I was on Scott boots and Hart Freestyles....(laughter).... they were 160cm as a matter of fact.

They just didn't cut it in racing. Actually, if your boots and skis are slowing you down in racing then they are also slowing you down in your recreational skiing, meaning you have out grown your equipment.



"SKIWI POINTS"

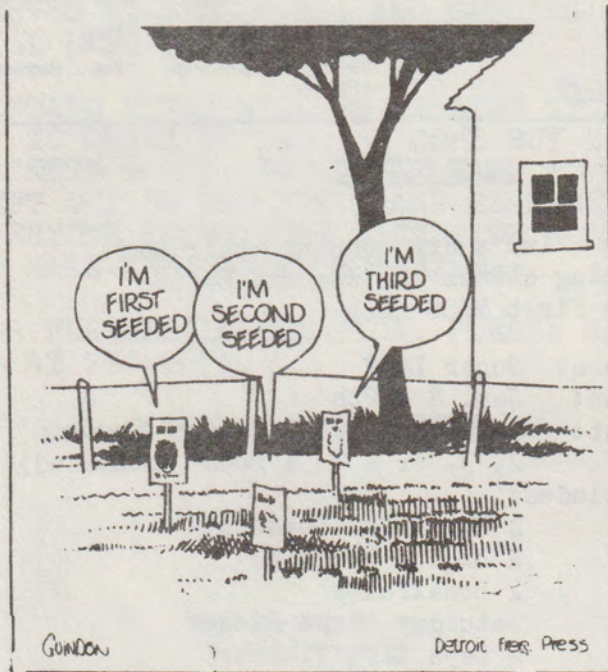
"WORLD CUP TROPHIES"

All racers are competing for world cup points. The top fifteen racers in each race receive points. First place is worth twenty-five points, down to fifteenth which gets one point.

These points are totaled at the end of the season and trophies are awarded on the last race weekend for the top three finishers.

These points are also totaled each week to determine the seeding order. The top seeded racer skis first in his or her class.

Skiwi racers get "Skiwi Points" for each race they enter. One point for entering a race and an additional point for each Skiwi you beat. Trophies are given at the end of the season for the best finishers in each class.

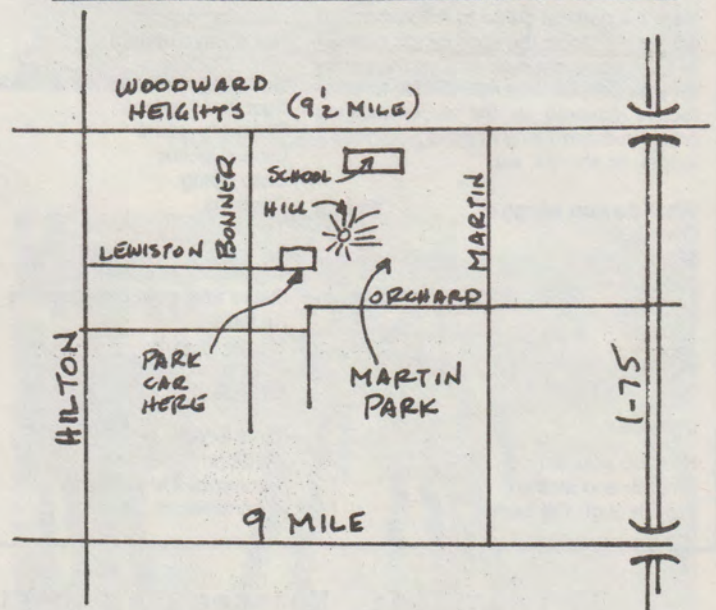
